

CAMPAIGN FINANCE

2022 Texas House Campaign

From July 1 to December 31, 2021, Verdell's campaign raised \$300. (Brittney N. Verdell, 7/1/21-12/31/21 Report, Texas Department of Elections, Filed 1/18/22)

ISSUES

Abortion

On her campaign website, Verdell criticized Texas' abortion laws and vowed to support the right to choose to get an abortion. "Every person should have the right and privacy to make the decisions that are best for their future. That includes a person's right to choose and to have the medical attention and expertise necessary in those crucial moments. When it comes to abortions, we must ensure that we do not infringe the rights of citizens and that the government doesn't pass policies that compromise the health of our communities. Right now, Texas has the most extreme abortion ban in this country which makes it nearly impossible for a person to receive an abortion and allows anyone — including anti-abortion vigilantes — to enforce the ban by suing abortion providers and anyone who helps a person obtain an abortion. This includes doctors, clinics sharing resources, and anyone who drives a friend or family member to an appointment. As State Representative of District 65, I will fight to ensure that the rights of every citizen are protected and to make sure every woman not only has a choice, but that every woman has the ability to have healthy, safe, and licensed medical treatment." Education

Verdell says her top priorities include increasing teacher pay, ensuring funding to meet students' basic needs, providing resources for mental health support in schools, and "strengthening the partnership between Legislatures and Superintendents." "As a mother of two, a public education graduate, and a Licensed Master Social Worker, I understand and value the impact of education in the public setting. My top priorities will be increasing teacher's salary, ensuring that schools have adequate funding to support the demands and needs of the students, providing resources that address basic needs and mental health, and strengthening the partnership between Legislatures and Superintendents." Verdell also said she would fight for funding to ensure teachers have funding for basic school supplies. "As State Representative of District 65, I will fight for all youth in the great state of Texas. I will fight to make sure that our teachers have appropriate funding for essential school supplies. I will fight to make schools a safe haven where our youth can focus on their studies and grow as youth into young productive adults ready to contribute a fresh and positive impact on society by time they graduate." Marijuana

Verdell supports the legalization and decriminalization of marijuana. "The economy of every state that has legalized marijuana has boomed while seeing a drastic decrease in nonviolent crimes connected to marijuana. That revenue can be used to provide additional resources that are needed for government funded organizations and areas that are hurting Texas communities by being drastically underfunded and under-resourced. Also, decriminalizing marijuana will protect minorities who are typically subjected to biases and arrested at disproportionate rates to get an equal fair chance as we repeal these laws. As State Representative of District 65, I will work hand in hand on a bipartisan effort to pass legislation around legalizing and decriminalizing marijuana that benefits all of Texas. I will also advocate for statewide regulations that not only oversee this industry but also increase jobs and will lower the unemployment rate even more." Police and Public Safety

Verdell said that she wants to pass legislation to keep "our brave officers protected in the field" but also support funding for family violence and mental health experts to support first responders. "Our first responders are important to our community. The work that they do and the sacrifices they make should not go unnoticed. That is why I believe that funding for public safety should be strengthened by partnering with community agencies. First responders risk their lives when responding to family violence and mental health calls. I believe that using funding to bring forth subject matter experts in the field of family violence and mental health with first responders will ensure that first responders are safe as well as the public. As State Representative of District 65, I will work on a bipartisan effort to pass legislation that keeps our brave officers protected out in the field but also ensures the best possible nonviolent outcome for all citizens of Texas."
